


OUR FATHER

GOSPEL MEDITATION



Purity isn't popular at the moment. Or is it? Look at a rack of health magazines or at popular podcasts. You'll see an infinite ocean of regulations and rituals of diets, intermittent fasting, morning sun rituals, intense juice detox practices, lists of dangerous foods, mental practices, as well as long lists of dos and don'ts for the proper cleaning of clothes, dishes, cars, houses, pets, and children. Like it or not, we long to be pure, clean, and without blemish.

This question of purity haunted people in Jesus' day, too. The Pharisees and scribes (the leading purity authorities of the day) criticize Jesus, asking, "Why do your disciples not live according to the

tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?" (Mark 7:5). Jesus responds by saying, "There is nothing outside the person that can defile him if it goes into him; but the things that come out of the person are what defile the person" (Mark 7:15). What does he mean, and how can it help us be pure?

We've probably all heard the somewhat shopworn interpretation that Jesus replaces the ritual, exterior notion of purity with a moral, interior one. Christianity is thus seen as a kind of moral re-tooling, as if religion doesn't make us pure. Good moral intentions do. But this doesn't take the rest of Jesus' ministry seriously enough, nor our obsession with purity. The better reading is that Jesus audaciously offers himself as the ultimate source of human purity — from within each human heart. Both our religious ritual practices and our moral actions are meant to flow from this encounter with Jesus the Lord. When we are in friendship with him, everything becomes pure for us.





Gospel Mk 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands. —For the Pharisees and, in fact, all Jews, do not eat without carefully washing their hands, keeping the tradition of the elders. And on coming from the marketplace they do not eat without purifying themselves. And there are many other things that they have traditionally observed, the purification of cups and jugs and kettles and beds. – So the Pharisees and scribes questioned him, "Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?" He responded, "Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written: This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts. You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition." He summoned the crowd again and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile. From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile."





A LETTER OF THANKS FROM FATHER JOE NETTEKOVEN

My Dear San Antonio Parishioners,

I sincerely want to thank you all for whatever way you contributed (financial, manpower or good thoughts) to rebuild the planter in front of my mobile home. I thank especially Deacon Russ Millspaugh for organizing all that it entailed: gathering the troops, estimating the size of the plot and ordering what was needed to fill that space. I thank all the men who came, both young (younger than me for sure) and a couple not so young. These were men from the parish office and a variety of organizations. They worked hard for 6 hours straight, taking only moments for a break to eat or drink something.

The project entailed removal of bushes with roots, weeds, and some sunken cement. Then it required the installation of gravel, a mat to prevent weeds and the installation of new gravel and ground cover. Finally, through the expertise of Mick Dwyer, a refining of my watering system for those thirsty little plants. It culminated in the installation of a St. Francis statue to speak to those brother and sister plants keeping them happy and well adjusted. And it seems that St Francis is already doing his job as I noticed hummingbirds drawing nourishment from some of the plants.

And then to top it all off and validate the work that was done... My neighbors have said thank you to me. They said it all looks great and remarked on how much work was done in only 6 hours. Comments have come from my neighbors who see my home from their windows, and the many people who walk around this park when the weather is cooler.

walk around this park when the weather is cooler. So my dear people, thank you to all who have had a part in making my mobile home now, as I would have liked it from the beginning, A House of Prayer: "My house shall be called a House of Prayer for all Peoples" (Isaiah 56:7).

God Bless you all.






